The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

As we celebrate our parish feast days this Sunday, we have moved from the celebration of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary to the celebration of the Holy Cross. The official name of the day is ‘The Exaltation of the Holy Cross.’ Why would you exalt the cross? Isn’t it a sign of shame, of the utter destruction and failure of the life of Jesus? That’s what everyone thought. Jesus surprised them all on the third day when he rose from the dead. The followers of Jesus discovered that in the Holy Cross of Jesus, they were saved and delivered. If they stayed united with him in his death, they would find life, resurrection, and salvation. This is why St. Paul said we should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ (Galatian 6:14). The Cross of the Lord was revealed not as the tree of unending death. The Cross of the Lord was revealed as the Tree of Life.

We sure have seen many things die during the past year or so. We had to die to our usual way of simple things like shopping and going out to eat. We had to die to our usual Mass schedule for awhile. Many people experienced real deaths in their families. Yet, thanks be to God, our parishes are still alive. For this, we should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is in this that we see the secret to keeping our parishes alive as God wants them. It was a lesson revealed by Jesus to his followers years ago, and it is the same lesson he reveals to us now. It was the very lesson he himself followed, “Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit.” (John 12:24) If we do not plant the seeds of the gospel in our lives and in the world around us, we will be barren or sterile. But when we do plant them—things grow!

Your generosity sure keeps things growing here. You continue to provide for the operations of our parishes. St. Mary Nativity School increased in enrollment from 116 to 140 students during the last year. Our Faith Formation program begins at the end of this month, also with new families. Holy Cross Polish School began their new year on Friday. These are all ways you plant the seeds of the gospel in the lives of our children and their families.

During the month of September and October, we will be tracking Mass attendance. We’ll want to see how many people are coming to receive Jesus on Sunday, compared to before the pandemic lockdown. In general we know, even before the pandemic, there has been a loss of many people. Our Lord continues to provide us each with Sunday, the Lord’s Day; fewer and fewer people are keeping it holy. Some people have asked me why Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration have died out at our parish. It is because we do not have people to adore our Lord. Adoration needs adorers. So I think we will have to die to our convenience in order to plant the seeds of faith in new people.

This was the insight of Fr. Delp, a Jesuit priest from Germany during World War II. He recognized the culture of death advanced by Hitler and the Nazis—and Delp had the courage to resist it and fight it. He gave his life for it. The Nazis threw him into prison. Fr. Delp learned how to put his old practices of praying to death, because now God was asking him to pray in prison. It was in prison that he still prayed and said Mass. He still preached and led retreats for other prisoners. His sermons were even smuggled out to plant the seeds of the gospel in the lives of others who were suffering. It was in prison that he made his final vows as a Jesuit, and he rejoiced that the chains of God’s love made the Nazi chains meaningless. The Nazis put him to death, but we rejoice in the hope that Christ raised him to new life.

Our crosses, our struggles, seem less in comparison. So let’s be more generous with the greater opportunities we have. Fr. Delp reminds us, each one of us, that one of the main tasks of our life is to prepare those around us able and willing to let the Holy Spirit work on them (Prison Meditations of Fr. Alfred Delp). God wants to fill them with his grace, with his eternal life—and he counts on us to get them ready.

This preparation precedes the proclamation of the Gospel. In fact, a ‘New Preparation’ must precede the ‘New Evangelization.’ We have been acting as though we have been given bread and wine for the transformation into the Body and Blood of Christ. What we really have in our hands is wheat and grapes—or in some places simply an open field.

An open field, an open church, waiting to be filled with the children of God. Let us have enough love in our hearts to share the seeds of Christ’s good news, no matter the cost, so that his children can be born to eternal life. Let us exalt the Holy Cross, the Cross of Jesus, in our own lives and parishes. Do you want your parishes to grow? Do you want to grow? Jesus asks us, “What will you plant?”

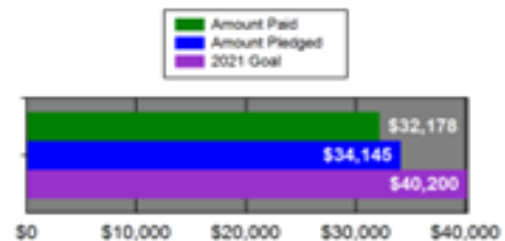

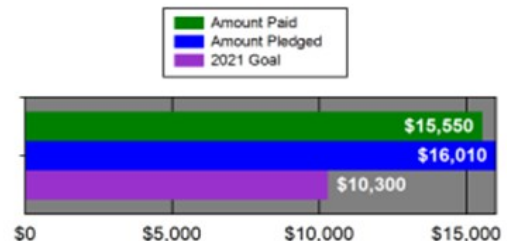

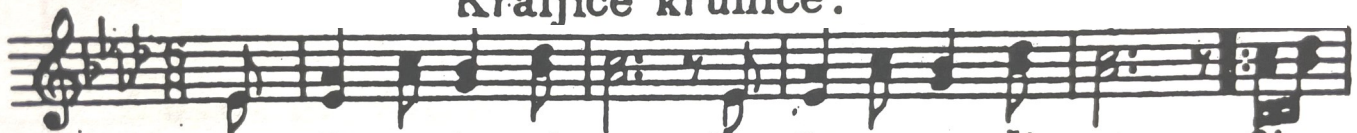

Therefore, you may hear the same hymn sung slightly different at each gathering of people. This depends on how it was passed on. All in all, it is a beautiful hymn honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary. It will be played and sung at the 11:00 AM Mass this Sunday, September 12th.

Special collection for Haiti recovery efforts set for weekend of Sept. 11-12

The people of Haiti have suffered greatly in recent days, as both an earthquake and tropical storm have struck the country located in the Caribbean Sea. Numerous lives have been lost, and many Church properties, along with homes and businesses, have been severely damaged or destroyed.

Catholic Relief Services is on the ground providing humanitarian aid, and the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America has approved \$10,000 grants to each of the three most affected dioceses. But more help is needed.

In his role as USCCB president, Archbishop Gomez of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles has called for a voluntary, special collection to support the USCCB Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund to provide additional aid to Haiti. The Diocese of Joliet has set the weekend of Sept. 11-12 for this special collection.
