

Do You Take This Woman to Be Your Bride?



Did you hear what happened at a local Catholic high school last month? A Catholic teacher lost their position because their wife was rejected. The Catholic Teacher was Christ. His wife is the Church.

Of course, that's not the way the media reported it. We were told that a lacrosse coach who is in a same-sex union with a woman was denied employment. "But isn't that legal?" It sure is. It was also legal to call black people property and sell them as slaves. It is still legal end the lives of babies waiting to be born. What is legal is sometimes wrong.

"What's the big deal? How much does a lacrosse coach teach the Catholic faith?" Well, those who opposed the move said otherwise. They wanted the coach hired to teach the school a lesson. They wanted the school to accept this legal marriage. They wanted the Catholic Church to get with the times and throw away her vision of marriage. Can't women love women these days?

They sure can, women sure can love women. My mom sure loved her daughters. My sisters sure loved each other. They also loved their daughters. None of those relationships were marriage. From the beginning, each woman has a beautiful openness within her that men simply do not have. As women mature, their body reminds them month by month that they could be wives, that they could be mothers. And if they offer this beautiful gift to a man, for life, sometimes a beautiful new child enters into this world. Each woman is blessed with the feminine half of the reproductive system. Isn't that amazing in itself? We have a complete respiratory system, a complete circulatory system, a complete nervous system, digestive system and so on. But the reproductive system has a feminine half and a masculine half. Regardless of who we are attracted to sexually, our bodies still speak this truth to us.

And if a man and woman freely offer their bodies to one another for life, those two truly become one flesh. And if that man and woman belong to Christ, he fills that union with his grace. Christ made marriage, true marriage from the beginning of the world; and then he made it into a

sacrament and filled it with his presence. And that sacrament comes to us from his Bride, the Church.

That's why it hurts me so much to see his Bride rejected. She is not just the Bride of Christ, she is my bride, too. I freely offered not to enter into the covenant of marriage so that I could serve like Christ the Groom. He called me to be a celibate priest. I will say it again, it hurts me personally to see my Bride rejected.

Those who embrace Christ's vision, revealed through his Bride, are Catholics. He and She are ready and willing to help each person along the way. True and compassionate and inclusive love is found inside the Heart of Jesus, not outside of it. No one know better than Christ that we often do not follow his way—it's why he died on the cross out of love for His Bride. So do not ask Christ and His Church to give up their love for one another. They are inseparable, united in a new and everlasting covenant. And they wait for us to choose to follow them, even in the midst of our bad and wrong choices. They know we can all love and that we all sometimes love badly. They wait for us to choose to love according to the Heart of Jesus.

Let everyone make their own, free choices. If the local school returns to the mission entrusted to them by Christ, they will survive. If they abandon Christ and his Bride and that mission, they will wither away. Oh, the buildings may still be there, and they still may be filled with students who will have excellent academic training. But those students will not learn how to get to heaven. Their learning will bear no fruit for eternal life.

Let each one of us make our personal, free choices, formed by the mind and the Heart of Christ, possessed by his Beloved Bride the Church. Our very life depends on the choices we make.






The Parish office will be closed on Monday, October 11, 2021 in observance of Columbus Day.

State lawmakers are meeting on October 19 and they are considering repealing the Parental Notice of Abortion Act. We must act to prevent this!





THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD JESUS
IN THE WOMB OF MARY
THE SEVENTH MONTH
SEPTEMBER 25 TO OCTOBER 25

Each year on December 25th we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on March 25, the feast of the Annunciation.

Our parishes have once again begun our 'Spiritual Adoption" program. Each month we will be keeping you up to date with the development of your baby. Mary and Joseph knew in advance that their baby would be a boy. And although Jesus was not his biological child, Joseph eagerly anticipated his birth. By the seventh month, the baby's hands grip strongly. His eyelids open and close as he surveys his increasingly cramped surroundings. The baby is now 15 inches long and weighs 2-3 pounds. The infant Jesus listens intently for his mother's recognizable voice. A child of seven months would survive birth. Four to 20 couples wait to adopt each available child. The average abortion takes 5-10 minutes. The average wait for adoption is 2-10 years.

Pray for all adoptive parents who provide the loving care and nourishing environment which every child deserves, and for foster parents who lend their hearts and homes to those whose fates hang in the balance.
