



Pastor's Corner



The Big Leagues

Imagine you're on a baseball team. I'm not talking about T-ball or Little League. Let's imagine you're a member of a Major League baseball team. You know you're going to commit yourself to an intense period of Spring Training. Why? You've got to get yourself ready for the regular season. But what if you give up when the season arrives? What if you fold up like a lawn chair? What are you then? The Chicago White Sox.

Well, it's early in the season. But here's the point: As Catholics, we commit ourselves to an intense spiritual training during Lent. Then when Easter comes, we can fold like lawn chairs. We forget that Lent is meant to prepare us for the 'regular season'—our ongoing battle to fight against the powers of sin and to fight for the power of God's holiness to grow within us. Think back to our three Lenten practices of praying, giving alms, and fasting. Since Easter Sunday, have you grown in prayer? The practice of prayer you began during Lent, did it become a solid habit of prayer that now fills your daily life? We know our excuses: "I'm too busy. I'm too lazy. I do enough. I'm too worried about the world." We also know our Lord's response: He appeared to his disciples in the midst of their daily lives, busy and frightening lives, and he brought them peace and joy and courage. Those are powerful rewards from the victory of Christ, rewards he want to bestow on you. The living Jesus is close to you each day, eager for you to take on the game of prayer. He waits for you to start the conversation with him.

How about our practice of giving alms? Were we so generous during Lent that the poor have been satisfied and no longer need our care? Most likely not, as Jesus said, "the poor you will always have with you." In fact, most likely the needs of the poor have increased as costs continue to rise and conflicts impoverish the world around us. Now is a good time to check if we have picked up the habit of helping Christ in the poor, according to our means. We meet the Risen Lord in those who are in need.

Lastly, let's look at our fasting. Maybe we think, "Now that Lent is done, so is my fasting." Well, we probably did it poorly during Lent forgetting our Lord's cross on Friday's and feasting on our favorite meats. We forget that our Lenten fast is meant to build up in us a solid habit of sacrifice. Each Friday we Catholics are meant to deny ourselves and share in the Lord's cross. Each day our Lord said we are to take up our cross and follow him. This means we don't give in to our whims or preferences or overindulge ourselves. Once again, the Risen Lord is close to you each day, waiting for you to offer him a sacrifice of love, even in the small things of each day.

The world certainly is not the holy place God intends it to be. God's opponents attack us relentlessly. There is a major battle going on each day and in each human heart. Christianity is not a spectator sport, but you as a disciple, are a key part of the team of Christ. God's grace wins the victory, but he counts on you and me to work with him. When we do that daily, with solid habits, we grow in virtue, we grow in goodness. And if we are in the state of grace, those virtues help us to grow in holiness.

Midway through our Easter season, let's recommit ourselves to uniting ourselves more closely to the Risen Lord each day. Even if you've given up, you're not out yet. He waits for you to start again, and to keep following him until we are safe at home—our heavenly home that lasts forever.





THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY

Each year on December 25th we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on *March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. (*Even though the feast of the Annunciation is designated as April 8th of 2024, we will continue to use the March 25th date. This will make our Christmas gift to our lord timely.) Our parishes have once again begun our 'Spiritual Adoption" program. Each month we will be keeping you up to date with the development of your baby.

THE SECOND MONTH -APRIL 25 TO MAY 25 Surely by now Mary has told her parents, Joachim and Anne, of her pregnancy. What must they think? How will they tell Mary's betrothed, Joseph the Carpenter? The law would have Mary stoned for adultery. They must trust in God! Today's unwed teenage mother may never know the comfort of loving parents or the warmth of understanding support. Without parental guidance or knowledge, the law allows her to terminate an infant before it has begun its journey into life. At two months, the child in the womb has a fully functioning body with fingers, toes, a brain, its tiny heart beating twice as fast as an adult's. His milk-teeth are present at 6 ½ weeks. Though only a little over an inch, it is now apparent that the baby is a boy or girl. Pray for teens in crisis pregnancies, that God will strengthen them to make the right choice.



Beginning Sunday, April 7 at SMN from 10 am until 12 pm

Every parish across the country is invited to host the Jesus and the Eucharistic study during the Year of the Parish Revival. This seven-session series will immerse participants in the kerygmatic proclamation (Sessions 1-4) and unveil God's saving work in the Eucharistic (Sessions 5-7).

Each session opens with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. We will then transition into small group discussions. Each session will be 2 hours or less.

Presented in SMN's JoAnn Room - enter through door "J"!

BELOW IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH SESSION:

Session 3: Am I saved?? Sunday, April 21 Salvation is a gift from God through Jesus Christ that requires our "yes".

Session 4: Why a Church? Sunday, April 28
Jesus didn't simply leave us a message or instruction manual to follow. He left us a living, dynamic Church where we can encounter him constantly and allow ourselves to be transformed into his likeness.

Session 5: God is with us. Sunday, May 5
God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gifting of the Eucharist, one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Jesus establishes the Eucharist to gives us strength for our journey, and to accompany us at every moment.

Session 6: The Story of the Eucharist Sunday, May 19
The story of the Eucharist is traced through Scripture - starting with Genesis and the Passover, through Jesus' miracles and teachings, the institution at the last supper, and the road to Emmaus. The cross is the new Tree of Life, and the Eucharist is its fruit.

Session 7: Bread for the Journey. Sunday, May 26
The Eucharist sustains us on our spiritual journey. Our
participation at Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the
Liturgy of the Eucharist is our offering of thanksgiving to God,
sending us forth to share what we have received.
