

# Pastor's Corner



# No One Takes My Life from Me

The State of Illinois has a voracious appetite for murder. Unsatisfied with attacks on human life at its beginning with extreme abortion, it now moves to take the lives of those who have reached the end of their time on this earth. This dark shadow of death moves over us through SB 3499, which would make it legal for a doctor to apply lethal drugs to those with a terminal disease who want to end their lives.

We might think, "Well, if life is painful, let's end it. Let the patient take their life." We actually have a wealth of experience to draw on in our nation, particularly from the State of Oregon where physician assisted suicide has been available since 1997. And it turns out that pain is not the major concern of those who consider suicide. Mostly, they grieve the loss of their autonomy and ability. They even miss the loss of friends and can't seem to find any joy in life. They don't want to be a burden to anyone. What does this show us? They worry more about the difficulties of life over their pain.

Life surely is difficult. Especially with the added burden of illness and the pain it brings. But it's better to kill pain, rather than people. We have the commandment, "You shall not kill." It's better to help someone carry their cross, rather than crucify them. Instead of taking life, we can learn how to give it. Isn't it better to love your neighbor, reassuring them that they are not a burden?

This was the approach of Jesus. He prepared his disciples for his own death with these words, "This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again." (John 10:17-18) Jesus will give his life, even for those who would crucify him. He would give his life for them, "so that sins may be forgiven." Then he gave us the command to do the same in his memory. When at the Last Supper Jesus says, "Do this in memory of me," he is not simply saying to celebrate the Mass. He is reminding us to <u>live</u> the Mass, to give our lives as a sacrifice of love.

Life ends. For each one of us, it will end and we cannot prolong it forever. To end it freely, before its time is murder. But to accompany a person along the way of the cross becomes a sacrifice of love. We provide them with comfort and care. We help them with their medicines and procedures, when those things still work. We provide them with food and water, when those things still do them good. When those things no longer help a person, we can discontinue them, because the time to meet our Lord draws near. No doctor can prescribe love. No pharmacy can dispense it. Only human hearts can apply it, as Jesus did, "He loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end." (John 13:1)

So please contact your state representatives and legislators. You will find our Illinois Catholic Bishops working together against this bad law. You can find the Catholic Conference of Illinois resources at ilcatholic.org.

But most importantly, let's help one another along the way of the cross. Jesus knows the pain of each one of us; it was his, on the cross. Jesus entered into death by giving his life, not taking it. He rose from death to show us another way to live. With his help, let us give our lives as a sacrifice of love, especially to those who are tested at their darkest moments. The living Jesus will help you to bring them hope and comfort. You can help them find the healing and strength of Jesus in his sacraments, brought to them by his priests. Our lawmakers crucify Christ again through this terrible law. But Christ has given you the gift to bring his life and resurrection to those who suffer.





# THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY

Each year on December 25th we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on \*March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. (\*Even though the feast of the Annunciation is designated as April 8<sup>th</sup> of 2024, we will continue to use the March 25<sup>th</sup> date. This will make our Christmas gift to our lord timely.) Our parishes have once again begun our 'Spiritual Adoption" program. Each month we will be keeping you up to date with the development of your baby.

THE SECOND MONTH – APRIL 25 TO MAY 25 Surely by now Mary has told her parents, Joachim and Anne, of her pregnancy. What must they think? How will they tell Mary's betrothed, Joseph the Carpenter? The law would have Mary stoned for adultery. They must trust in God! Today's unwed teenage mother may never know the comfort of loving parents or the warmth of understanding support. Without parental guidance or knowledge, the law allows her to terminate an infant before it has begun its journey into life. At two months, the child in the womb has a fully functioning body with fingers, toes, a brain, its tiny heart beating twice as fast as an adult's. His milk-teeth are present at 6 ½ weeks. Though only a little over an inch, it is now apparent that the baby is a boy or girl. Pray for teens in crisis pregnancies, that God will strengthen them to make the right choice.





# Beginning Sunday, April 7 at SMN from 10 am until 12 pm

Every parish across the country is invited to host the Jesus and the Eucharistic study during the Year of the Parish Revival. This seven-session series will immerse participants in the kerygmatic proclamation (Sessions 1-4) and unveil God's saving work in the Eucharistic (Sessions 5-7).

Each session opens with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. We will then transition into small group discussions. Each session will be 2 hours or less.

# BELOW IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH SESSION:

Session 4: Why a Church? Sunday, April 28
Jesus didn't simply leave us a message or instruction manual to follow. He left us a living, dynamic Church where we can encounter him constantly and allow ourselves to be transformed into his likeness.

Session 5: God is with us. Sunday, May 5
God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gifting of the Eucharist, one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Jesus establishes the Eucharist to gives us strength for our journey, and to accompany us at every moment.

# Session 6: The Story of the Eucharist Sunday, May 19

The story of the Eucharist is traced through Scripture - starting with Genesis and the Passover, through Jesus' miracles and teachings, the institution at the last supper, and the road to Emmaus. The cross is the new Tree of Life, and the Eucharist is its fruit.

# Session 7: Bread for the Journey. Sunday, May 26

The Eucharist sustains us on our spiritual journey. Our participation at Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist is our offering of thanksgiving to God, sending us forth to share what we have received.
