

Pastor's Corner

The Passing of a Priest

The Catholic world marked the passing of a priest this week. He was only days old. I don't mean he was only ordained for a few days—his entire existence was only a couple of days. His name was Fr. Justin—the 'artificial intelligence' priest.

Fr. Justin was created by the group called Catholic Answers. This is a group committed to giving solid, true answers to those who have questions about the Catholic faith. It turns out they get so many

requests that their employees and volunteers can't handle the workload. So they experimented with artificial intelligence, trying to train a computer generated avatar to offer orthodox answers to the questions it received.

Some people thought this was an abomination, due to some of Fr. Justin's glaring mistakes. "In one alarming instance, a screenshot shared online showed the computer priest seemingly hearing a woman's confession, assigning her penance, and absolving her of her sins, concluding with the words, 'Go in peace, my child, and sin no more.'" (from the Times of India) So Catholic Answers 'removed him from ministry,' although they reminded everyone Fr. Justin was not an actual, living person. In some ways this was unfortunate, because people had engaged him in a way that produced profound and true responses, too. "When asked why you should go to church on Sunday, Father Justin answered with brief quotations from Scripture ... and also explained: 'When we gather together for Mass, we are united with Christ and each other in a profound way. We hear God's Word in the Scriptures, and we receive Jesus himself in the Eucharist. ... Going to church isn't just an obligation, it's a privilege and a joy." (from the Catholic News Agency)

Let's remember here how as Catholics we engage all technology, and more widely, all created things. God made all things good. (see the creation accounts of Genesis) But once placed in our human hands, how do we use those good things? Nuclear power can be tamed to provide electricity, to heat our homes in the winter and cool them in the summer. It can also be unleashed to destroy innocent human lives, as we did with the civilian casualties at Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The internet can be used to communicate boundless moments of entertainment, and even multiply the world's prayers. Yet one of its most rampant uses is pornography.

So Fr. Justin could be used for good, in the right hands. Obviously he wasn't a real person, so he could not offer real sacraments. That would need to continue to be said, loud and clear. He made some obvious mistakes—like some real priests. That always needs fixing. Technology has persistent recalls of its products, AI is no different. Humans need constant learning, priests are no different.

In my judgment, Fr. Justin was a safe and easy way for people to connect with our Catholic faith. At Catholic Answers, he was fulfilling a demand our human limits couldn't fulfill. Yes, technology, and all created things, can always be misused. That will continue, even without Fr. Justin. But God has given us the ability to overcome the misuse by an abundance of good. (Romans 12:21) Fr. Justin may be gone, but you are still here. Your phone, your tv, your computer, your tablet: all these things have been placed in your hands. What will you do with them? Will you use them as God wants? Because we suffer among ourselves when his world is misused. The whole world awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God, who will use his world in a way that brings him glory. (Romans 8:19)



THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY

Each year on December 25th we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on *March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. (*Even though the feast of the Annunciation is designated as April 8th of 2024, we will continue to use the March 25th date. This will make our Christmas gift to our lord timely.) Our parishes have once again begun our 'Spiritual Adoption" program. Each month we will be keeping you up to date with the development of your baby.

THE SECOND MONTH —APRIL 25 TO MAY 25 Surely by now Mary has told her parents, Joachim and Anne, of her pregnancy. What must they think? How will they tell Mary's betrothed, Joseph the Carpenter? The law would have Mary stoned for adultery. They must trust in God! Today's unwed teenage mother may never know the comfort of loving parents or the warmth of understanding support. Without parental guidance or knowledge, the law allows her to terminate an infant before it has begun its journey into life. At two months, the child in the womb has a fully functioning body with fingers, toes, a brain, its tiny heart beating twice as fast as an adult's. His milk-teeth are present at 6 ½ weeks. Though only a little over an inch, it is now apparent that the baby is a boy or girl. Pray for teens in crisis pregnancies, that God will strengthen them to make the right choice.





Jesus and the Eucharist Study

Beginning Sunday, April 7 at SMN from 10 am until 12 pm

Every parish across the country is invited to host the Jesus and the Eucharistic study during the Year of the Parish Revival. This seven-session series will immerse participants in the kerygmatic proclamation (Sessions 1-4) and unveil God's saving work in the Eucharistic (Sessions 5-7).

Each session opens with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. We will then transition into small group discussions. Each session will be 2 hours or less.

BELOW IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH SESSION:

Session 5: God is with us. Sunday, May 5

God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gifting of the Eucharist, one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Jesus establishes the Eucharist to gives us strength for our journey, and to accompany us at every moment.

Session 6: The Story of the Eucharist Sunday, May 19

The story of the Eucharist is traced through Scripture - starting with Genesis and the Passover, through Jesus' miracles and teachings, the institution at the last supper, and the road to Emmaus. The cross is the new Tree of Life, and the Eucharist is its fruit.

Session 7: Bread for the Journey. Sunday, May 26

The Eucharist sustains us on our spiritual journey. Our participation at Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist is our offering of thanksgiving to God, sending us forth to share what we have received.
