

THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD, JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY

Each year on December 25th, we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on *March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. (*Even though the feast of the Annunciation is designated as April 8th of 2024, we will continue to use the March 25th date. This

will make our Christmas gift to our lord timely.) Our parishes have once again begun our 'Spiritual Adoption" program. Each month we will keep you up to date with the development of your baby.

THE EIGHTH MONTH - OCTOBER 25 TO NOVEMBER 25

Mary's pregnancy is nearing its completion. The crib and baby clothing are ready. But the best laid plans are sometimes turned upside down. The village is abuzz with the news that those of the House of David will be called shortly to Bethlehem to be counted among this princely dynasty.

In Mary's eight month, the Infant Jesus' skin begins to thicken and layers of fat are stored underneath for insulation and nourishment. Antibodies are building up. Jesus' quarters are getting cramped; chin on chest, his knees, arms and legs are bent. Many twins are born in the eighth month.

A Letter from Holy Cross Finance Council

We are grateful to all members of Holy Cross Mission for their support. The following annual report will give you an analysis of our financial condition for fiscal year July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024. We want to thank all members of Holy Cross Mission for all that they do and the generous sharing of their financial resources that enables us to do all that we have been able to accomplish with God's help.

As we look over the state of Holy Cross Mission, we have much to be thankful to God for. Our parish is doing well financially, but we do have bills to pay, who hasn't. In general, Holy Cross Mission had a good, successful financial year, though it involved a struggle, which is true of everyone in these times of inflation. We currently can pay all our expenses. We thank God from the bottom of our hearts for all He has given us.

The overall income for July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, was \$312,841.00. This is a slight decrease of about 4.8 % over our previous fiscal year. Sunday collections were \$137,970.00 which is an increase of about 7.7% from last fiscal year.

As we stated in our last year's annual report, a significant part of our income for the past several years came from renting our school building to the Head Start program. The rental lease came to an end. Fortunately, our parish found a new renter for our school building. This will be an increase in our income for the 2024/2025 fiscal year.

We have completed the tuckpointing on two areas of the church building. The back side and the north side of the church still need to be completed. The financial expenses for all the work that is being done will have to be addressed in the coming year and for several years forward.

Because of the Joliet Deanery Targeted Restructuring, we delayed our Capital Campaign Fund program. Fr. Clive will have further information on this in the upcoming year.

We pray that working together and with your continued financial support and God's help we will continue to go forward. Let us continue to be proud of Holy Cross Mission and work to strengthen and deepen our parish family spirit and grow in Christ together.

List Rady Finansowej Polskiej Misji Świętego Krzyża w Joliet

Jesteśmy wdzięczni wszystkim członkom Polskiej Misji Świętego Krzyża za okazane wsparcie. Poniższy raport roczny zawiera analizę naszej sytuacji finansowej za rok obrotowy od 1 lipca 2023 r. do 30 czerwca 2024 r. Pragniemy podziękować wszystkim członkom Misji Świętego Krzyża za wszystko, co czynią, i za hojne dzielenie się swoimi środkami finansowymi, dzięki czemu możemy dokonywać – z pomocą Bożą – wszystkiego, co faktycznie udało się nam osiągnąć.

Kiedy patrzymy na stan parafii Świętego Krzyża, mamy za co dziękować Panu Bogu. Nasza wspólnota radzi sobie dobrze finansowo, ale mamy też rachunki do płacenia - któż ich nie ma! Ogólnie rzecz biorąc, Misja Świętego Krzyża miała dobry, udany rok finansowy, choć wiązało się to się z trudnościami, co jest prawdą dla nas wszystkich w czasach inflacji. Obecnie jesteśmy w stanie opłacić wszystkie nasze wydatki. Z głębi serca dziękujemy Bogu za wszystko, czym nas obdarzył.

Całkowity dochód od 1 lipca 2023 r. do 30 czerwca 2024 r. wyniósł 312 841,00 USD. Oznacza to niewielki spadek o około 4,8% w porównaniu z poprzednim rokiem budżetowym. Składki niedzielne wyniosły 137 970,00 dolarów, co stanowi wzrost o około 7,7% w porównaniu z ubiegłym rokiem.

Jak pisaliśmy w naszym zeszłorocznym raporcie rocznym, znaczna część naszych przychodów w ciągu poprzednich kilku lat pochodziła z wynajmu budynku naszej szkoły na potrzeby programu *Head Start*. Tamta umowa najmu dobiegła końca. Na szczęście nasza parafia znalazła nowego najemcę budynku. Da nam to wzrost naszych dochodów w roku fiskalnym 2024/2025.

Zakończyliśmy zewętrzne prace naprawcze dwóch ścian budynku kościelnego. Do wykończenia pozostała jeszcze tylna (wschodnia) oraz północna część murów kościoła. Koszty wszystkich obecnie wykonywanych prac będą musiały zostać poniesione w nadchodzącym roku, jak również przez kilka kolejnych lat.

Ze względu na tzw. ukierunkowaną restrukturyzację Dekanatu Joliet opóźniliśmy realizację programu Funduszu Kampanii Kapitałowej. Ks. Clive przekaże dalsze informacje na ten temat w nadchodzącym roku.

Modlimy się, abyśmy wspólnie, przy Waszym stałym wsparciu finansowym i pomocy Bożej, mogli nadal iść naprzód. Bądźmy dumni z Polskiej Misji Świętego Krzyża i pracujmy nad wzmocnieniem i pogłębieniem naszego parafialnego ducha rodzinnego oraz wspólnym wzrostem w Chrystusie.

This is Part 2 in a 3-part series of columns on the importance of your help in the formation of new priests

Priests do not come from a big warehouse

When I was a little boy, I would often wonder where priests come from.

It's funny now, but I really thought there was a giant warehouse or training facility where they were waiting for a call from the coach to put them in the game. Almost like with baseball, when it was their time, they would get called up from the minor leagues and if they did well, they stayed and if they didn't, they'd be sent back.

Now I know that isn't the case, but to a second grader it made all the sense in the world. The truth is, priests come from families. They come from homes like yours and mine and they live ordinary lives like everyone around us. They go to school, play sports, have hobbies, some dated, some didn't, they participate in Church, and they have friends and siblings who help form their character and a real sense of who they are as a person and what they stand for. It is from within this community that they

begin to know and have a relationship with God.

One of the greatest obstacles to young men knowing that the priesthood is something they might be called to



is apparent lack of support from within the family for a priestly vocation.
We were often asked if we wanted
to be a doctor, a lawyer, a teacher, an
engineer or something else when we
grow up, but rarely were we asked
if we ever thought about the priesthood. Now, I know it is objectively
different because it is a vocation and
not a career, but what if we gave it the
same attention? I truly believe more
men would be open to exploring the
thought that 'maybe I'm supposed to
be a priest.'

So, what are three things a parent can do to create space for a priestly vocation in the family?

1. Make Sunday and any sacramen-

tal occasion (Confession) special.

- 2. Take time to talk about how God has impacted your own life and show your children how you pray.
- Live well the life of virtue and continue working on your own marriage.

Whether it is simply the prayers before meals, Weekly Sunday Mass, or an occasionally rosary or sacrament of confession, these men encountered God and began to walk with Him. They may not have always prayed or been the best people, but God is faithful and walked with them through their ups and downs just like our families do with us.

From within the family, a vocation is cultivated, and it is only with the support of parents, grandparents, siblings and friends that a young man can be open to a priestly vocation.

At some point, these men began to recognize within themselves that they were made for more — for a deeper relationship that called them to make a gift of themselves, to pour themselves out for the sake of others.



Loving Others Fully:


Jesus says it's just as important as loving God. It means treating others the way you want to be treated. It's showing kindness, empathy, and forgiveness.


