

Master, I want to see....

One of my favorite coming to faith's song is, "Christ be our light." The song aptly tries to grasp the deep human longing of knowing. We all want to know about things in life so that we can fit in and above all expand our human knowledge so that we can become the best version of ourselves. Unfortunately, our pursuit of knowledge can be derailed by others who want us to be invisible and remain in our darkness. What can we do?

The Gospel this weekend treats us to the same episode in the story of Bartimeus, the man born blind. He longs to see and in desperation, he cries out to Jesus to come to his aid. Those around him try to hush him instead of empathizing with his plight. His faith in Jesus doesn't dwindle and he calls out the more until he gets what he wants.

Keep seeking the highest good, and God, who sees your longing, will grant your request. May we all have the wisdom to ask what is truly important in our lives, the grace to see ourselves as God does! Seeing brings light to our lives and where there is light, no darkness can stand. Jesus says, "I am the light of the world!" May we have the courage to step out of the darkness surrounding us, the ignorance of settling for less than we deserve, and embrace Jesus, the eternal light that never sets. May we learn to see the face of God in everything around us and one day to see God face to

face in eternity. May our prayer be

"Master, I want to see!"





Importance of the impact a priest can make

I invite you to take a moment and think of a priest who has impacted your life. There may be one or many, and these may be good, bad or both. The truth remains that our lives would be forever different had we not encountered or experienced them. A priest who is well formed, holy, and seeking after the heart of Jesus has the power to radically shape and shift the culture of a parish. They, because of the grace given them by God, release into the world his presence, bring healing, and work miracles in the community they are called to serve. These priests who have been well formed, give hope for the future and in the presence bring about stability because they are firmly rooted in the conviction of the call they have received.

This impact, or as I like to call it, the ripple effect of grace, moves from the Eucharist into the community, our homes and then into the world. I've seen this personally through healing miracles, transformed communities,

vocations to marriage, consecrated life, priesthood, and the mixing of generations as the young and older walk together the life of faith. They say a holy priest forms great people

and a great priest good people, etc.

Our church, your family, and your community deserve great and holy priests. This is the work of their seminary education, formation, and their shared experiences with you in the parish community. It is a great joy to watch as the young men see the possible impact they can make on the lives of people around them.

I ask that you take a moment to pray for your parish priest that he would be happy, healthy and holy. Please also pray for the young men in your parish that their hearts would be open to a call to priesthood. Lastly, please pray for our seminarians that they will grow in their love of God and love of the future community they will serve.

ABOUT FR. BORELLO

Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.

Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.

He attended the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.

While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.

He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.

He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.

In August of 2015, he began serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to more than 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.

He returned to the Diocese of Joliet in August 2018 to begin as the Director of Vocations.

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT: USHERS

Catholic Kids Column Spiritual Blindness

Imagine how Bartimaeus must have felt at this moment that Jesus calls to him. He's so eager to meet Jesus that he leaves his cloak, his only possession and means of warmth, and goes to Jesus. Nothing else matters.



He's filled with faith that this encounter with Jesus will change everything for him.

And he's right. Jesus asks him, "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus doesn't hesitate. He says, "Master, I want to see." Jesus tells him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." And just like that, Bartimaeus can see! His whole life changes in an instant. But here's the thing: Bartimaeus doesn't just go back to his old life. He can see now, and that changes everything. He uses his new gift of sight to follow

So, what does this mean for us? Like Bartimaeus, we can suffer from blindness. Maybe we're not physically blind, but there are things in our lives that we can't see clearly. Maybe we're blind to our bad habits, our sins, or the way we treat others. We might be blind to the prejudices we hold or the way we judge people who are different from us. Sometimes, we are even blind to how much God loves us, or we might not truly see the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

What are some ways you might be blind right now? Is there a part of your life that needs healing, something you've been ignoring or avoiding? We all have areas of blindness, and just like Bartimaeus, we need to recognize them and call out to Jesus for help.
