





Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has given Catholics in the United States an opportunity to share faith in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout Latin America and the Caribbean islands.

Through the Collection for the Church in Latin America, Catholics in the United States can express a closer unity with and love for their brothers and sisters in Central and South America and the Caribbean islands. This unity was fully expressed in autumn 2024, when Catholics from around the world gathered for an International Eucharistic Congress in Quito, Ecuador, to celebrate the country's 150th anniversary of its consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Using funds received from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the Archdiocese of Quito welcomed thousands from around the world—including a delegation of Catholics from the United States led by Bishop Andrew Cozzens—to pray together, encounter the love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and share their faith. When you participate in the collection at your parish, you support special events such as the Eucharistic Congress as well as the ongoing work of forming catechists, supporting vocations to priesthood and religious life, and implementing family ministries throughout Latin America.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of January 25-26, 2025. Please be generous toward this collection. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish's online giving platform. Catholic Kids Column "Do WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU"

The story of the Wedding at Cana in the Gospel of John gives us a little glimpse into the relationship between Jesus and Mother Mary. Jesus, Mary, and the disciples are at a wedding celebration when the hosts run out of wine. In those days, this would have been very embarrassing for the family hosting the event.

When Mary notices the problem, she goes to Jesus



right away and points it out. She is interceding for the hosts, asking Jesus to help them out in their time of need. Jesus doesn't say no. In the end, he decides to honor his mother's request and help the wedding hosts. This ends up being Jesus' first public miracle—just because his mom asked!

Mary's role in the story doesn't end there. After she tells Jesus about the lack of wine, she speaks to the servants and tells them, "Do whatever he tells you." She knows that Jesus will need the servants' cooperation, and she expects them to respect his authority. Mary's instructions to the servants remind us that following Jesus requires action on our part.

Mary's words to the servants—"Do whatever he tells you"—are words for us, too. Just as she trusted Jesus at the wedding, she encourages us to trust him in our own lives. She shows us that when we bring our needs to Jesus, he hears us. But we also have to be ready to do what he asks, even if we don't fully understand. We might pray and ask for his help with something in our lives, but if we aren't willing to follow his guidance, we might miss the blessing he has in store for us


