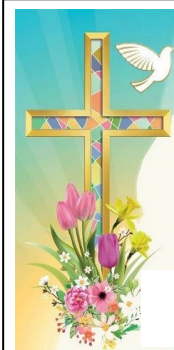

THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD, JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY



Each year on December 25th we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For centuries the Church has also celebrated his conception on March 25, the feast of the Annunciation.

Our parishes have once again begun our "Spiritual Adoption program." Each month we will be keeping you up to date with the development of your baby.

THE SIXTH MONTH - AUGUST 25 THRU SEPTEMBER 25

Mary now feels the quickening of the Child Jesus that proclaims his presence within her womb. She sings to him and feels his response. At six months, a special covering (vernix) forms to protect the baby's skin from the fetal waters. The baby's eyes, closed since the seventh week, are now open to its surroundings. The infant is now 12 inches long and weighs 1 ½ pounds. This baby could survive birth. Despite the fact that a child of six months has a chance at life, women may legally abort their unborn at any time throughout the nine months of their pregnancy. Pray for all physicians, midwives and nurses that they may recognize the sanctity of life and God as the author of life.

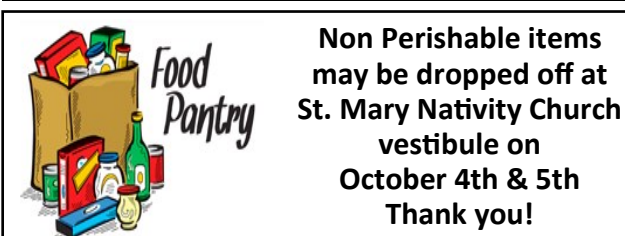

Catholic Kids Column JOHN 3:16

Today's Gospel passage is one of the most important parts of the Bible because it explains why Jesus came into the world. Jesus talks about how He would die on the cross so that we could have eternal life. He also shows us just how much God loves us. God's love is so great that He sent His only Son, Jesus, to help save us from sin. Jesus did not come to punish or destroy people. He came to help us believe in God and to lead us to Heaven. He wants us to live in the truth and walk in the light. People who do not believe in God might try to hide their sins in darkness, but those who follow God will live in His light and receive eternal life.

Today is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. When we look at the cross, we might first think of pain or sadness. But for us as Christians, the cross is actually a powerful sign of love. Jesus did not have to die on the cross. He chose to. He knew it would be painful, but He did it anyway because He loves us that much. He gave everything, even His life, so we could be saved and have eternal life with Him. That kind of love is selfless. It does not give up, even when things get hard. Sometimes we think of love only as being nice or saying kind things. But real love, like the love of Jesus, means sacrificing, forgiving, and caring for others even when it is not easy. The cross reminds us of that. It teaches us that true love is strong, brave, and full of hope.

True love is not always easy. Jesus' love for us cost Him everything. This challenges us to ask: How can I love like that? Maybe it means forgiving someone who hurt your feelings, helping someone when it's inconvenient, or standing up for what's right, even when it is not popular. Sometimes we think of Jesus's love as something meant for everyone in general. But the cross reminds us that His love is personal. Jesus would have gone through all of it—even if it was just for you. That is why the cross is not just something we look at. It is something we carry. Jesus said, "Take up your cross and follow me" (Luke 9:23). That means we are invited to follow His example of love, sacrifice, and service. So, what small "cross" can you carry for someone this week?
