


October is the month of the Most Holy Rosary

Drodzy Parafianie!

Dziękujemy za poświęcenie czasu na przeczytanie naszego Rocznego Sprawozdania Finansowego. Z przyjemnością przedstawiamy Wam roczne sprawozdanie dotyczące stanu naszej parafii za rok podatkowy, który skończył się 30 czerwca 2025 r.

Doceniamy wszystko, co czynicie jako członkowie rodziny parafialnej Świętego Krzyża. Tylko dzięki Waszej silnej wierze w Boga, Waszemu udziałowi w wydarzeniach kościelnych i hojnemu dzieleniu się Waszymi środkami finansowymi mogliśmy zrealizować wszystko, co osiągnęliśmy, wychwalając naszego Pana Jezusa Chrystusa we wszystkim, co robimy.

Przy tym wszystkim pragniemy, abyście wiedzieli, że bycie członkiem Parafii Świętego Krzyża to coś więcej niż Wasze wsparcie finansowe i zaangażowanie osobiste. Wiemy, że wielu młodych i odchodzących od Kościoła katolików nie czuje się związanych z tym Przymierzem miłości. Wielu nie czuje się związanych ze swoją wiarą, spełnionych i świadomych; jeszcze inni mają trudności ze zrozumieniem misji naszego kościoła.

Możecie to zmienić! Razem możemy podnieść na duchu naszą wspólnotę wiary. Po pierwsze, prosimy Was o modlitwę i do zachęcania innych do modlitwy razem z Wami. Może być pomocne zaproszenie kogoś, kogo znacie, na niedzielną Mszę świętą. Wiele lat temu czyjś dobry przyjaciel miał trudności z powrotem do Kościoła katolickiego w pojedynkę. Ale kiedy mógł przyjść z kimś z parafii, ta decyzja powrotu stała się łatwiejsza i zasiane zostało ziarno, które pomogło mu wrócić do Kościoła katolickiego. i dziś jest on katolikiem o silnej wierze.

Chcielibyśmy podziękować za wszystko, co już ofiarowaliście naszej parafii. Pamiętajcie, że Wasze datki sprawiają, że ta parafia tętni życiem i ma ogromny wpływ na otoczenie. Prosimy, pamiętajcie o naszej parafii również w tym roku i rozważcie w połączeniu z modlitwą zwiększenie wkładu w jej działalność, abyśmy mogli nieść Eucharystię tym, którzy jej tak rozpaczliwie potrzebują.

Miniony rok podatkowy kolejny raz ukazał wielkiego ducha parafii Świętego Krzyża. Przyznajemy, że parafia nadal odnotowuje niewielki deficyt w wysokości (\$ 5280,00) za rok podatkowy od 1 lipca 2024 r. do 30 czerwca 2025 r. Jednakże jest to znacznie mniej niż w poprzednim roku podatkowym, kiedy to deficyt wynosił (\$ 53 830,00).

Całkowity dochód za rok podatkowy wyniósł \$ 336 366,00. Stanowi to wzrost o około 7% w porównaniu z poprzednim rokiem podatkowym. Niedzielne zbiórki w roku podatkowym kończącym się 30 czerwca 2025 r. wyniosły \$ 135 602,00. Był to spadek w porównaniu z poprzednim rokiem podatkowym o \$ 2368,00.

Jednym ze sposobów, aby pomóc nam kontynuować naszą posługę w Parafii Świętego Krzyża, jest rozważenie przekazywania darowizn online. Pomoże nam to zapewnić solidną bazę składanych ofiar.

Zakończyliśmy trzyletni projekt fugowania zewnętrznych ścian naszej świątyni. Teraz będziemy mogli skupić się na innych potrzebach remontowych w naszych trzech budynkach.

Nasz budynek szkolny jest nadal wynajmowany przez Centrum BHP Pracowników Latynoskich (Latino Worker Safety Center) za miesięczny czynsz \$ 2101,50. Zapewnia to dodatkowe dochody dla naszego kościoła, za co jesteśmy naprawdę wdzięczni. Całkowity dochód z wynajmu, jaki otrzymaliśmy w bieżącym roku fiskalnym, wyniósł \$ 25 218,00.

Jesteśmy wdzięczni wszystkim członkom naszej parafii, którzy nadal ofiarnie wspierają naszą posługę parafialną, pomimo trudności finansowych, z jakimi boryka się wiele rodzin.

Niech Pan Bóg Wam błogosławi, abyście nadal sami byli błogosławieństwem dla naszej parafii Świętego Krzyża.

How to Support Your Priests

Parishioners can encourage the priesthood by praying daily for vocations and for priests, by encouraging men they know to consider the priesthood, and by actively supporting the church's vocation ministry. Encouraging a priestly vocation includes recognizing spiritual commitment, such as regular participation in prayer and spiritual events, and speaking to potential candidates to offer support and invite them to explore the possibility of a vocation. A supportive community that fosters openness to God's call is crucial for men and women to discern and respond to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

The Four Dimensions of Priestly Formation

When a man enters seminary to discern the priesthood, he begins a journey of conversion and formation that touches every part of his life. The Church, through the Program for Priestly Formation (PPF), outlines four key dimensions—sometimes called "pillars"—that shape this journey.

The first is human formation, the foundation of it all. A priest must be a man of integrity, balanced and virtuous, capable of relating well to others. Next comes spiritual formation, which roots him in friendship with Christ through daily prayer, the Eucharist, and a life centered on holiness. Intellectual formation, the rigorous studies in philosophy and theology, prepare the man to explain the faith clearly and faithfully. Finally, pastoral formation prepares them to be shepherds—through hospital visits, parish ministry, encounters with the poor, and hands-on experiences of serving God's people.

These dimensions aren't separate boxes to be checked. They are woven together so that the seminarian is gradually shaped into a man configured to Christ the Good

with human effort. In the end, priestly formation aims at this: a man so conformed to Christ that he can lay down his life for the flock.

ABOUT FATHER BORELLO

Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.

Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.

He attended the University

of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.

While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.

He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.

He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.

In August of 2015, he began

serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to over 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.

He returned to the Diocese of Joliet in August 2018 to begin as the Director of Vocations.







Catholic Kids Column Value of Humility

Think about the Pharisee in this Sunday's Gospel. He stood up and prayed out loud about how great he was. He listed all the good things he did—fasting, giving money, following the rules. But then he did something worse. He said, "Thank you, God, that I'm not like other people," and even pointed to the tax collector as an example. He was

using his prayer to brag. He wasn't really talking to God with a humble heart. He was trying to look good.



Now think about the tax collector. He didn't even look up. He stood far off and said only one thing: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." That was it. No big speech. No comparing. Just a simple, honest prayer. And Jesus says that he is the one who went home "justified." That means he was made right with God. He wasn't perfect, but he was honest.

Let's talk about comparing. Why do you think it's so easy to fall into that trap? Maybe you've looked at someone else and thought, "At least I'm not like that person." Or maybe you've felt bad because someone else seems smarter, more popular, better-looking, or more talented. Comparison goes both ways. It can make us feel proud, or it can make us feel like we're not good enough.

The Pharisee focused on other people's sins. He didn't look at his own heart. The tax collector did the opposite. He wasn't thinking about other people at all. He knew he needed God's mercy, and that's what he asked for. That's what made the difference.

So what does this parable teach us about how God sees us? It shows us that He values the heart more than actions done to impress others. He wants us to be real with Him. When we admit we need Him, when we stop pretending, that's when we grow closer to Him.

This story is an invitation. Jesus is telling us, "Come to Me as you are. Don't worry about being better than anyone else. Just be honest. Just be humble. I will meet you
