





#### HOW DO WE MAKE DISCIPLES?

Advent sometimes just feels like that time that is sandwiched between Thanksgiving and Christmas – life is hectic with Christmas shopping, parties, the school year ending, and so much more. But as Catholics – we really ought to enter into this season of joyful anticipation with purpose and intention! In How to Advent, we will discover the rich traditions that mark this season and how they aid us in preparing our hearts for the birth of the child Jesus at Christmas. Guided by priests, religious, professors, and a charismatic host, you will gain practical tips and spiritual reflection on the practices of the Advent calendar, Advent wreath, Jesse tree, and nativity scene.

### Catholic Kids Column Finding Peace

Let's be real—life can feel overwhelming. There's so much going on around us that we can't control. We hear about wars and violence on the news. We see natural disasters and protests. Maybe someone in your family is sick. Maybe there's fighting at home or drama with friends. School might feel like too much. Or maybe you just feel anxious, tired, or lost. It's easy to feel like everything is falling apart.

Jesus knows that feeling. In today's Gospel He talks to His followers about a time when things would get really bad. He says the temple in Jerusalem, the most holy place for the Jewish people, would be torn down. Then Jesus says even more hard things are coming: wars, earthquakes, hunger, and betrayal. People will be scared. People will suffer.

But then Jesus says something surprising. He says, "Do not be terrified." That's kind of crazy, right? How are we supposed to stay calm when everything is falling apart? But Jesus doesn't stop there. He promises that even in the middle of all that, God is still in control. He says, "Not a hair of your head will be destroyed." That doesn't mean nothing bad will ever happen to us. It means God sees us. He knows us. And He is with us through it all. Jesus finishes by saying, "By your endurance you will gain your souls." That means if we hold on to Him, we'll find something even greater than safety—we'll find peace that lasts.

Think about your life. What's been making you feel stressed or out of control lately? Maybe you've been worried about your grades, or your future, or your friendships. Maybe it's bigger stuff—like feeling unsure about the world or your place in it. You're not alone in that. Everyone feels that way sometimes.

Jesus says "do not be terrified." That doesn't mean we won't feel scared sometimes. It means we don't have to live in fear. We can bring our fear to Him. We can pray, even if it's just a simple, "Jesus, help me." He hears us. And He reminds us that peace isn't about everything being perfect. It's about knowing that God is with us, and we are not alone.

Think about someone in your life who helps you feel safe or calm. Maybe it's a parent, a friend, a teacher, or a youth leader. Why do they give you peace? Usually, it's because they listen, they care, and they stay with you. Jesus does all those things too. He listens. He cares. And He never leaves.

Jesus never promised a perfect life. But He promised to walk with us through every storm. He tells us not to give up, even when it's hard. He invites us to stay close to Him and trust Him one day at a time. That's how we start finding peace—by keeping our eyes on Jesus, even when the world feels like it's falling apart.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Your support for this collection November 15/16 brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God. For more than 50 years, CCHD has helped low-income people address the root causes of poverty and injustice, not by giving "one-size-fits-all" handouts, but by funding local organizations that empower low-income people to make positive impacts in their own communities. This grassroots model allows people to use their experiences and knowledge of their communities to build coalitions of faith leaders, local businesses, and other neighbors who work together to find solutions that benefit everyone.

When you give to the CCHD collection, you make an impact nationally and at home, because 25% of your contribution stays within your own diocese. This way you help your own community build on this legacy of success while also helping communities across the country. Local grant recipients in our diocese include emergency assistance and food pantry supplies for St. Vincent De Paul chapters, vocational job training for adults with disabilities, and community outreach programming for at-risk youth and families. 
