




Catholic Kids Column

Second Sunday of Advent

In this Sunday's Gospel, John the Baptist calls people to repentance. He's not gentle about it either. He speaks with bold words to people who were very sure of their own holiness. Some of them thought they were fine just because they were part of Abraham's family. In today's language, that would be like saying, "I'm Catholic, I go to church, so I'm good." But John said that wasn't enough. God wanted their hearts to change. He wanted them to show real signs of that change. Not just talk about being good. Not just look holy on the outside. But to actually live differently, with honesty and humility.

Immaculate Conception

Catholics celebrate the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. This feast day reminds us of God's special plan for Mary. It is a day to honor her and thank God for her purity.

Mary's role in Salvation History is deeply connected to Jesus' mission. She is called the new Eve. This title shows her importance in redemption. Just as Eve played a part in mankind's fall, Mary played a part in our salvation.



Eve's disobedience led to the fall of mankind. She did not follow God's command. In contrast, Mary's purity and obedience played a vital role in salvation. She followed God's will perfectly.

The Immaculate Conception means Mary was free from original sin. This special grace made her the perfect vessel for Jesus. Her purity set her apart from all others. The angel Gabriel announced that Mary would bear the Son of God. This event is called the Annunciation. Mary responded with complete trust and surrender to God's plan.

Mary's "Yes" at the Annunciation is called her fiat. Her agreement allowed the Incarnation to take place. This shows the importance of human cooperation in God's plan. Without her "Yes," the world would not have received Jesus.

Mary's role as Jesus' mother is central to her mission. She nurtured and cared for Him. Her faith and obedience make her a model for all Christians. She always followed God's will

Mary's example inspires believers to trust in God's plan. Her life is a guide for us. She encourages us to say "Yes" to God's will, just as she did. Her trust in God was complete.

As the new Eve, Mary reversed the disobedience of the first Eve. Her purity and obedience brought salvation. She played a vital role in God's plan.

Mary's role is multifaceted: new Eve, pure vessel, and obedient servant. Each aspect of her life teaches us something important. Her example helps believers follow God's will in their own lives. We look to her for inspiration and guidance.



THE NINE MONTHS OF THE CHILD, JESUS IN THE WOMB OF MARY

This is the last in a series of nine monthly reflections on the development of Jesus in the womb. Our parish began the series on March 25 when we celebrated the Feast of the Annunciation. Soon we will celebrate the wonderful Feast of the Birth of Jesus at Christmas. You and your baby's names will be lovingly framed and placed near the nativity scene at each parish as a birthday gift to Jesus.

THE NINTH MONTH - NOVEMBER 25 TO DECEMBER 25

Bolstered by provisions and buoyed upon a cushion of carpets, Mary perches upon their patient donkey as she and Joseph start their journey. The trip to Bethlehem should take four days, but Mary's pregnancy forces them to travel slowly. Do they perhaps fall behind their fellow travelers? Soon they will be entrusted with the life of God made man. How must they reflect on this awesome responsibility as they journey toward their destiny? At nine months, the baby is posed head down for its descent into the world. At birth, approximately 280 days from conception, a baby normally weighs from 6-9 pounds; it may be 19-21 inches long. Its tiny heart pumps 300 gallons of blood per day.

How can this not be a child? Give prayerful thanks to God for his most precious gift to humanity—Jesus Christ, his only son.



A Qualified Charitable Distribution is a transfer of funds from your IRA donated to a qualified charity. These funds can be considered toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year. There are certain guidelines that apply, but your RMD, as a charitable contribution, will exclude that amount from your adjusted-gross income for the year and you might get tax advantaged savings. The IRS requires withdrawals from IRA's based on age. The funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline which is usually December 31.







Please consider making your Qualified Charitable Distribution to St. Mary Nativity or Holy Cross. Both are 501(c)(3) organizations eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions.

You should consult your financial advisor and tax preparer when making this distribution.




