

## LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

# TRUTH

Let's talk honestly about relationships. You spend time with friends every day, and some of you may already be thinking about dating. These connections can be great. They can help you feel supported, accepted, and loved. But they can also be confusing, frustrating, and sometimes even hurtful. That's why it's important to look at what Jesus says about how we treat each other.

In Matthew 5:17-37, Jesus doesn't just tell us to follow a list of rules. He goes deeper. He wants us to look at what's going on inside our hearts. He talks about anger, lies, lust, and making promises. But what He's really showing us is that relationships only work when they're built on truth and respect. You can't fake love. You can't fake loyalty. You can't fake friendship. And you can't just say the right words if your heart is not in the right place.

Jesus says, "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.'" That means be real with people. Say what you mean and mean what you say. Don't lie to get attention. Don't pretend to care about someone just to look cool. If you're in a friendship, be a good friend. Stand by them. Tell them the truth. Don't say one thing to their face and something else behind their back.

In a true friendship, honesty builds trust. That might mean telling a friend something they need to hear, even if it's not easy. Maybe they're heading down a bad path, and you care enough to say something. Or maybe it means admitting when you've hurt their feelings, even if you didn't mean to. Being honest doesn't mean being harsh. It means speaking with love and listening with care. It means giving your friend space to be honest with you too.



Jesus teaches us that real love starts with truth. That's not just a nice idea—it's something we live out every day. When we're honest, we protect our hearts and the hearts of others. We show that we care. We build trust. We grow stronger as friends and as followers of Jesus. This kind of honesty isn't always easy. It takes courage. But it also brings peace and joy.

You don't have to be perfect to have good relationships. But you do need to try to be honest and kind. Ask Jesus to help you speak the truth and act with love. Pray for the strength to be the kind of friend who shows up, who listens, who tells the truth even when it's hard. That's how we follow Jesus. That's how we love like He does. And that's how we build friendships that really last.

## Bishop Dennis E. Spies Appointed Apostolic Administrator for the Diocese of Joliet

Joliet, Illinois — [February 6, 2026] — The Diocese of Joliet announces that Bishop Dennis E. Spies has been appointed Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Joliet, effective immediately. Bishop Spies assumes this role in accordance with the norms of the Catholic Church, ensuring continuity of leadership and pastoral care for the nearly half-million Catholics across the seven counties of the diocese.

Bishop Spies, who has been serving as Auxiliary Bishop of Joliet and Titular Bishop of Cenculiana, brings more than two decades of pastoral, administrative, and formational experience to this responsibility. Ordained to the priesthood in 2002, he has served the Diocese of Joliet as pastor, seminary formator, and most recently as Vicar for Clergy, a role in which he has been widely recognized for his pastoral sensitivity, collaborative leadership style, and deep commitment to the well-being of priests and parish communities.

"I am humbled by the trust placed in me and remain committed to serving the people of God in the Diocese of Joliet with faith, integrity, and hope," Bishop Spies said. "Together, we will continue to proclaim the Gospel, strengthen our parishes, and accompany one another as disciples of Jesus Christ."

As Administrator, Bishop Spies will oversee the day-to-day governance of the diocese until the appointment of a new diocesan bishop. His responsibilities include supporting diocesan ministries, guiding clergy, and ensuring the smooth functioning of pastoral and administrative operations.

Born in Clifton, Illinois, Bishop Spies earned his undergraduate degree from Southern Illinois University Carbondale before completing seminary studies at Mundelein Seminary. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Joliet by Pope Francis in 2024 and ordained later that year at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus.

The Diocese of Joliet asks the faithful to join in prayer for Bishop Spies as he undertakes this important new role in service to the Church.




